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Purpose of Position	As part of a multi-disciplinary team, work towards building capacity within Yolnu communities by utilising cross-cultural, bi-lingual, adult educational processes.
Skills and Attributes required for the position	Competent in listening to and speaking Yolnu Matha or willingness to commit to learning language.
	 Demonstrated capacity to work sensitively across cultures.
	 Demonstrated understanding of adult education and/or community development concepts and practices.
	 Demonstrated capacity to work in a flexible, changing environment and as part of a multi-disciplinary team.
	Highly developed research and writing skills.
	 Demonstrated ability to explain the workings of dominant culture systems eg Parliament, government, public and private service delivery contexts.
	Ability to undertake self-directed learning
Essential	Willing and able to travel to remote communities and homelands in North East Arnhem Land on a regular basis
	Australian Drivers Licence
Location	Winnellie, Darwin, NT
Employment Terms	Permanent, full time position for two years with 6 month probation period. More flexible work arrangements can be negotiated.
	Approx \$52-55,000 per annum (ARDS has PBI status). 6 weeks recreation leave and 10 days sick leave per year.

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KEY DUTIES

- 1. Participate and, in time, lead face-to-face education sessions in communities, including conducting discovery education in language.
- 2. To learn Yolnu language, be genuinely interested in learning about Yolnu culture, and learn and apply 'discovery education' methodology to support the goals and mission of ARDS.
- 3. To use ARDS language-based resources (including Yolnu dictionary and correct spelling of Yolnu words).
- 4. To produce audio education programs in collaboration with Yolnu consultants.
- 5. Produce multimedia education programs in collaboration with the ARDS Multimedia Team, Yolnu consultants, educators and participating stakeholders (eg DVDs, manuals, videos & radio plays etc).
- 6. Work as a team and assist colleagues, when needed, to organise project logistics, prepare reports and submission writing.
- 7. Prepare funding applications to expand and grow the work of ARDS while building partnerships, networking and collaborating with other service providers.
