Moderator Reflection

For the first time, the Northern Territory had to go into lockdown because of the Coronavirus. We may have panicked, gotten angry and frustrated because all the activities must be carried out from home including prayer meetings, bible studies and pastoral visits. And the supermarkets get raided of all the essentials and we ask, "when will this uncertainty be over?"

This panic was also experienced by the disciples of the Lord Jesus (Mark 4:35-41). "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" This is the Sea of Galilea, a body of water 680 feet deep and surrounded by hills. Winds blowing across the land intensify close to the sea, often causing violent and unexpected storms. The disciples were seasoned fishermen, who had spent their lives fishing on this huge lake, but during this squall they panicked.

This uncertainty occurs in every area of life. The disciples needed rest, but they encountered a terrible storm. In panic the disciples came to Jesus saying they will drown. Jesus stood up, told the wind and the sea, "Silence! Be still." The wind and the sea obeyed under Jesus' command and power. The disciples lived with Jesus, but they underestimated him. They did not see that his power applied to their very own situation and crises.

The Christian life may have more stormy weather than calm seas. As Christ's followers, be prepared for the storms that will surely come. Do not surrender to the stress but remain resilient to recover from setbacks with faith in Christ. Hold one and another in prayer and trust and move ahead. Rest assured that, "When things go wrong, He will make them right. The God of the good times is still God in the bad times. The God of the day is still God in the night." (God of The Mountain by Lynda Randle)
