

### **Rev David King**

Broome Uniting Church congregation was pleased to welcome David and Leonie King at the beginning of 2018. David was inducted as Minister of the Word in April 2018.

During the five years in Broome, David supported the congregation through leading worship, Bible studies and visiting. He was a valuable worker in the Op Shop where his practical skills were often called on. He took ministry opportunities with visitors under the shade of the cashew fruit tree.

David was a member of the Broome ministers' group, and an active leader in the ecumenical events at Easter and Christmas.

When COVID came, David and the congregation members quickly adapted to deliver worship via zoom. This way, they maintained ministry to those caught in lockdowns in Derby, Perth & interstate.

In the ABC TV series "Mystery Road" Series 2, the Broome UCA church featured as a film set. David assisted the producer by sourcing props and costumes from the church op shop.

David's responsibilities in PPNA and the Northern Synod grew over the five years. He attended PPNA and Northern Synod meetings from 2018-2023 and Synod in Alice Springs.

He served on the PR&PC as the Broome representative and later was made chair of the PRC of the PPNA. In May 2022, he travelled to Brisbane for the 16th Assembly as Northern Synod representative.

David worked for Congress as ministry support agent to Mowanjum. He supported Pastor Kirsty Burgu and the work in West Kimberley. Each visit to Derby took 200 kilometres each way. He assisted in funerals and Bible study with the Derby faith community.

Finally, thanks and appreciation to David for his faithful service & fellowship. Our thoughts & prayers go with David & Leonie as they begin their new life of retirement. May God continue to bless you and keep you.

### Rev Jo Mar

As a young man, Jo worked as a Civil Engineer, but hearing God's call to ministry, he trained for ordination at the United Theological College in Sydney. He once said that he changed from building physical bridges linking places, to building spiritual bridges to join people to God.

When Minister in the southern highlands of New South Wales, based in Tumut, he was approached about a placement with NRCC as West Kimberley Support Worker, based in Derby. He commenced in this role in 2013.

Jo worked closely with the Mowanjum congregation. He was a mentor for Kirsty Burgu, leading to her commissioning as a Pastor. With the opening of the new regional prison near Derby, he began chaplaincy work there. He worked with Howard Amery on bible translation work in the Worrorra language. With his wife Losana, he developed an Op Shop at Mowanjum, training local people to run it. Using his practical skills, he developed the facilities at the small church building in Mowanjum. In Derby, he led a weekly bible study group at the church site.

In 2020, he was called to work with NRCC based in Darwin and commenced as the NRCC Presbytery Minister in September 2020. He retired from this position in December 2022.

Jo is remembered as a Minister with a deep pastoral heart for those who are marginalised. His gentle presence is a blessing to all who know him. We wish Jo and Losana all the best in the next chapter of their lives.

### Rev Lindsay Parkhill

Since 2008 Lindsay has served as the West Arnhem Support Worker for the Northern Regional Council of Congress. He started this position as an interim and was then ordained in 2009. This lengthy service with the Northern Regional Council of Congress has produced much fruit.

The communities of Jabiru, Maningrida, Warruwi and Minjilang and associated outstations, have grown in their Christian witness and service. Many people have taken up various leadership positions including, youth leaders, pastoral leaders, music leaders. The West Arnhem Area Council's adopting of a scarf recognition system has meant people have felt valued in their Christian service and have intentionally led others into this service. Lindsay facilitated these initiatives and helped the Area Council take on this responsibility.

Another key part of Lindsay's ministry in West Arnhem has been cross raising ceremonies. Different communities across both West and East Arnhem land have been supported by Lindsay to raise crosses at important sites. There has also been important baptism events and ongoing discipling throughout the area.

Lindsay's gift in languages and encouragement of context specific worship and leadership development has been greatly appreciated across West Arnhem. He will be greatly missed and we wish him and Louise well in the next phase of their ministry service.

### **Rev Peter Wait**

Rev Peter Wait's association with the Northern Synod started in several ways. He worked as a teacher for two years in Barunga near Katherine. He also spent time in Arnhem Land and was a volunteer with Uniting Care Wesley Adelaide at Pukatja (Ernabella).

With a growing connection and sense of call to the Northern Synod Peter was asked to consider the Frontier Services position of what was then called the Tennant Barkly Patrol, now the Tennant Barkly Remote Area Ministry. Peter accepted the call to this ministry and commenced in this placement on 1 May 2013.

Based in Tennant Creek, part of Peter's role was ministering in the Uniting Church there, including coordinating its op shop and the workshop and community gardens on its property. Peter also fostered and protected the ecumenical connection between the Uniting Church congregation and the combined Holy Name Anglican-Lutheran parish in Tennant.

Peter was called to be proactive in his ministry, travelling across the vast area of approximately 600,000 square kilometres. Tennant Barkly Remote Area Ministry

covers around 120 stations and communities, as well as people in roadhouses, caravan parks and national parks. With the Remote Area north of him vacant he even travelled as far as Mataranka and offered church services there. A particular passion of Peter's was his work in the prison (Barkley Work Camp), where he often visited, running church services and chaplaincy.

A key part of his ministry was meeting people and having conversations about significant things. He knows the importance of being there for people, incarnationally embodying God's love and care for people. He certainly has a gift of presence, representing the church which is in turn representative of God's love on earth.

Peter's ministry has also included:

- Support for staff and volunteers for the Northern Territory Emergency Services and being a member of the Bushfire Brigade
- Supporting a "coffee lounge" after church which has provided social contact, a snack, and some healthy food for those in need.
- Delivering food parcels and low-cost clothing for people who are ill and hospitalized
- Providing chaplaincy services to aged care residents
- Fostering and maintain relationships with other caring professionals in Tennant and the Barkly

In the wider Northern Synod context, Peter has served faithfully on the Pastoral Relations and Placements Committee, where he often joined Joint Nominating Committees as well. His active participation in Presbytery and Synod meetings was also always appreciated. He maintained connection with the Centralian Remote Area Ministry and helped Benjamin Quilliam settle into that role in 2017.

After over ten years of faithful service in Tennant Creek Peter concluded his placement in August 2023. Tennant Creek is not an easy place to live, so his tenacity there is commendable. The connections he had made and the love that had grown for the people of Tennant Creek made it hard for him to leave the placement. He has returned to Adelaide for now.

### Rev Dr Helen Richmond

Helen started at Nungalinya College in 2009 using her significant skills and experience to facilitate the learning of key Indigenous leaders across the country. In 2018 Helen moved to Casuarina Uniting Church where her pastoral care, preaching, worship leading and gentle heart were greatly appreciated.

From 2019-2023 Helen was a valued member of the Pilgrim Presbytery Pastoral Relations and Synod Placements Committee. Due to her ministry at Casuarina, her previous work with Nungalinya College and her other connections through the wider church and community, Helen would often bring an important perspective or insight to the consideration and discussion of items on the meeting agenda. Her pastoral gift was also apparent, especially in the prayer section of the meetings when Helen would add to the prayer list individuals and situations needing care that other members may not have been aware of. Helen's wisdom and her thoughtful contributions to the work of this pastoral oversight will be missed.

Helen actively developed relationships with the Islamic community in Darwin, particularly the Casuarina Mosque.

She has also been a powerful advocate for Peace in Israel/Palestine and spent 3 months in the West Bank as a peace observer at the conclusion of her placement with Casuarina.

We wish her and Ben well in the next phase of their ministry in the Paramatta-Nepean Presbytery. We will miss their contribution to the life of this Synod.
