What is Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE)?

CPE is an intensive and practical training program in pastoral/spiritual care using an action/ reflection model of learning, supplemented with teaching sessions and reading. Participants will explore how to be present to others who are experiencing distress and how to offer grounded spiritual interventions informed by self-awareness, one's own faith background and best practice.

CPE consists of a minimum 400 hours of learning made up of:

200 hours of placement 90 hours of group work

10 hours of individual supervision 100 hours of reading, reflection and preparation

Details

A Darwin/Adelaide based online CPE unit facilitated by Helen Vester, an experienced CPE Educator.

Dates: 3 July – 4 December 2025

Group work: Group days will be mostly Thursdays each week 9am-4:15pm (Darwin time). Exact

days/dates available on request. Attendance at group days is compulsory as

classes are not recorded.

Individual supervision: 10 hours of individual supervision are included. Times to be negotiated.

Placement: Average 10 hours/week.

Cost: \$2000 (If enrolled through the University of Divinity (UD), FEE Help is available

and UD fees apply.)

Helen Vester (B Theol, MA(Theol), Grad Dip Ed, B Tech(Hons), Prov CPE Consultant, AAOS supervisor)

is an experienced CPE Educator and Professional Pastoral Supervisor based in Perth. She has a background as a high school teacher, prison and hospital chaplain. A Catholic layperson who embraces Ignatian spirituality and contemplative forms of prayer, Helen enjoys supporting people to develop their pastoral identity, grounded in their spiritual values. She also has a private practice offering professional supervision to clergy and others in pastoral roles. In her spare time Helen enjoys hiking, travelling and exploring Australia with her husband in their camper.
